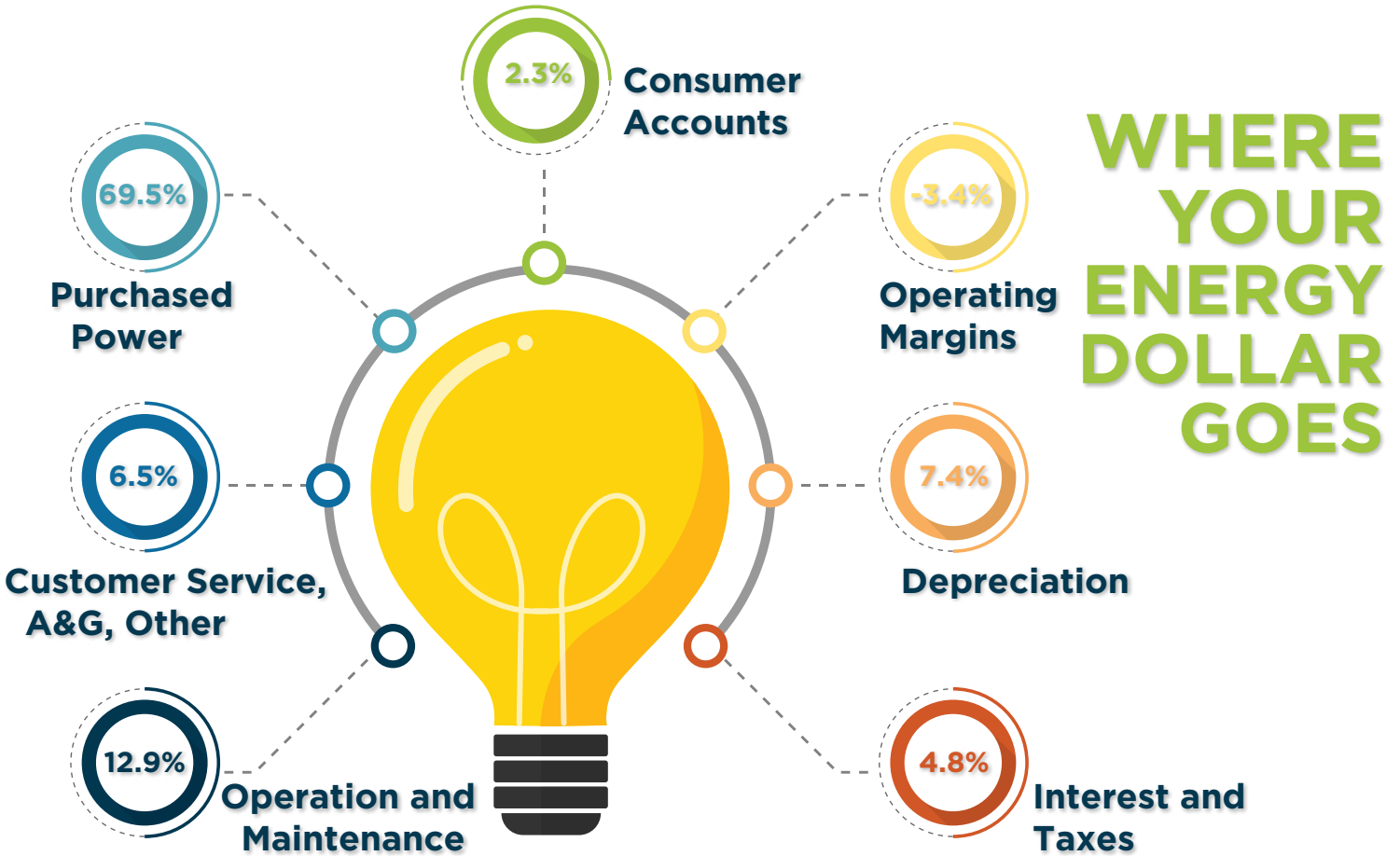

In addition to a registration gift, registered members will receive a \$15 energy credit.

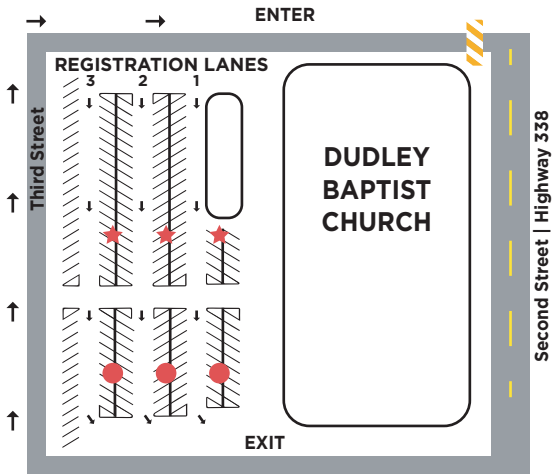
To help expedite the Annual Meeting registration process, each member will receive, by mail, a registration card.
